



Interview with FOPL Board Member Suzanne Fischer

On November 22, 2014, I had the pleasure of welcoming Suzanne at my home. Suzanne is on the FOPL board because one day she noticed an item in the FOPL Newsletter about seeking new members. She decided to apply and was very pleased to be invited to attend a FOPL meeting. Suzanne joined the FOPL Board this year, and is now an active member.

Suzanne loves libraries and wanted to find ways to support this vital local institution. She is interested in recruiting a new generation of members to FOPL and in spreading the word more broadly about various ways to financially support the Oakland Public Library. For example, she would like to attract more Friends and Potential Donors, emphasizing that it is not necessarily important to donate lots of money, but rather that participation in general is crucial. She also pointed out that social media is an especially important way, these days, to communicate the importance of the library. Suzanne was born and raised in Detroit, Michigan. She attended the University of Minnesota, graduating with a degree in the History of Science. She moved to Oakland two years ago, for her new position as a History Curator at the Oakland Museum of California. Before that she was a Curator at the Henry Ford Museum in Detroit.

especially science fiction. Her favorite subjects in school were English and Biology. She would often go to the library in the suburb where she lived. Her parents enjoyed reading - mostly fiction and so there were many books to read in their home. There was also a piano, and recordings of symphonies - Suzanne enjoys Bach and Bartok in particular. But Bob Dvlan was a favorite of her father's! Suzanne smiled when she mentioned that she moved her piano from Detroit. Makes sense! Suzanne thoroughly enjoys singing in the Bella Musica Choir.

In the future she hopes to write books about People and History, particularly those with connections to Science and Technology. Suzanne is an Independent Scholar not affiliated with a University and therefore finds the Link+ system available through OPL indispensable for her research.

Elmhurst Branch Library Garden Project

In 2013 the Friends of the Elmhurst Library was awarded an \$800 grant from Keep Oakland Beautiful to improve the landscaping around the branch and develop a small vegetable garden to be planted and maintained by neighborhood young people.

The first part of the project was to plant shrubs and flowering plants in front of the library and to purchase tools and gloves for the litter walks the Friends sponsor on 88th between International Way and Holly.

The second part was completed last Fall when members of the Friends, library staff, and local young people planted vegetables in planter boxes built by branch security guard Darin Lloyd during his off hours.

Kourosh Hessam of Marduk Productions donated and installed (at no charge to the Friends) a prototype of a self-watering system that he has developed. In return, the Friends have agreed to provide him with feedback regarding its efficiency. A win-win for both.

Special thanks to volunteers Mayra Pascual and Tony Simon who now help maintain the garden.




The first harvest has taken place and the gardeners are enjoying the fruits (veggies) from all their hard work.

The funniest versions of such letters are included, but there are letters on many other topics (the tables of contents include Finding Wasps Nests, Marmalade at Breakfast, Americana, This England, and of interest to all, How to Get a Letter in The Times). These books are a snapshot of the serious and esoteric concerns of the English, from 1900 to 1985.
