Since June, shop volunteers have hustled and jostled hundreds of boxes of inventory to empty the warehouse and storage unit into the new location's footprint, while simultaneously organizing the back office and front of the house to create a functional operational flow. In addition to carving out pathways to move around the new space, the team has also bolstered its volunteer roster,



garnered free furniture donations for both the office and storefront, and installed beautiful wooden shelving from Mills College to create space for more

material. The team also hosted its first after-hours event, staying open til nearly 9:00pm on Saturday,

July 27 during two legs of Oakland's 2024 Beast Crawl Literary Festival. All the while, the craw pushed inventor

Get to Know Your Grants

Congratulations to 2024 Oakland Youth Poet Laureate Ella Gordon! On June 7, Ella performed alongside the eight other Finalists who had competed for the title. The nine Finalists wowed the crowd with poetry, their passion, and

their support for one another during performances at the Oakstop in downtown Oakland.

Ella, a senior at Oakland Technical High School, won a \$5,000 college scholarship generously funded by the Friends of the Oakland Public Library. She will represent the Oakland community through poetry, media and public appearances. "Poetry is a voice," Ella said. On being the 2024 Oakland Youth Poet Laureate, she says, "It is such a humbling experience to be appreciated for the very thing that allows me to speak. I am lucky enough to be supported by a creative and immensely talented community of poets that are my eternal inspiration and motivation. This program has given me and young poets all over Oakland the platform to share our voices and flourish. I am supremely honored to be this year's voice."

This powerful program would not be possible without the financial support from the Friends of the Oakland Public Library. In addition to funding the scholarship, the Friends of the OPL pays for the social media advertising, event space, finalist prizes, and refreshments.

Sharon McKellar, the OPL librarian who supervises the Teen Services department and the Oakland Youth Poet Laureate program, said, "It's impossible to overstate the importance of the Friends' contributions. Library staff and volunteers work very hard to encourage applicants, to connect young writers with resources, and to create a real community of young poets. But things like snacks and advertising and the scholarship prize are absolutely critical to the success of the program. My colleagues and I are so grateful -- thank you!" Remembering Judy Toll

Many in the Friends of the OPL community remember long-time volunteer Judy Toll. She was a regular Friday afternoon Bookmark Bookstore volunteer and a cheerleader for the Friends at OPL events. She represented the Oakland Friends in a county-wide group of Friends of the Library groups that met periodically to share information and best practices.



A former school librarian who retired from San Leandro High School after more than 20 years of service, Judy began volunteering at the Bookmark in 2001 and joined the Friends of the OPL board in 2003. She served as board Secretary from 2005-14 and chaired the Bookstore Committee from 2011-17. After stepping down from the board in 2017, Judy continued to volunteer at the Bookmark until 2020.

Judy loved reading and had a special passion for theatre, travel, art, and picture books.

On May 20, 2023, Judy passed away. She is sorely missed by family, friends, and fellow volunteers.


We are touched to share that Judy's contributions to the Oakland Public Library continue. Judy and her husband Bob included a bequest to the Friends in their estate plan which will help the Friends to support the library in the future. And last fall, Bob decided to give a generous gift now, in Judy's memory.

In 2024-25, this gift will cover the costs of the Story Bus, a beloved program which provides transportation from preschool through kindergarten classrooms in the West Oakland neighborhood to the West Oakland Library. At the library, the children have a special storytime with library staff and then they choose one book each to take back to their school. This simple but effective program helps children to develop a love for reading and to learn about the many resources to be found at the library.




RAZORBLADE TEARS
